The Workshop on Document Security begins with an introduction related to risk analysis and assessment issues and proceeds to important factors related to: the degree of security associated to the classification of general and confidential documents, level of protection, etc.

The workshop is designed and developed to give you a hands-on manual on how to review and solve the problems related to document security including the use of IT tools for the purpose.

The workshop then enlarges to issues such as security of perimeter, network and technology focusing on the security of the document management system as a whole. The security issues regarding in-house storage and transmitting the documents to outsourcing agencies and partners.

Document issues such as access rights and logs for auditing purposes will also be addressed to..
